FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



What is a Kiss and Ride?

A marked lane on a street near a school or on school grounds that is only for the drop off or pick up of students by vehicle. It is designed to reduce traffic congestion and improve student safety during drop off and pick up.



Can I park and exit my vehicle in the Kiss and Ride?

Drivers must remain in their vehicles. Please do not leave your vehicle unattended. If you need to walk your child to school or the car, please park in a designated parking area and cross at the crosswalk (if available).



Can I arrive early to ensure a spot to drop off or pick up my child?

Arriving early will cause traffic congestion. Try to time your arrival before the bell in the morning and 5 to 10 minutes after the bell in the afternoon. If you do not see your child in the waiting area, complete a loop.



What do I do if there is no space to safely stop in the Kiss and Ride?

Please do not double park. Delays are brief. Please wait until it is safe to move forward in the Kiss and Ride lane. Dropping off or picking up your child in the driving lane increases the risk of an accident.



How can I increase my child's safety when entering or exiting the car alone?

Review safety tips:

- Enter and exit the car from the passenger side.
- Stay on the sidewalk whenever possible.
- Wait for traffic to come to a complete stop before crossing.
- Make eye contact with drivers to be sure they see you before crossing.
